

## Has Anyone Seen Normal?

Have you seen Normal?


## He's been missing for days.




He was there last Thursday at my piano lesson.




But when it was time to bake on Saturday, Normal was gone. It just isn't like him to not show up.



I really miss him. Do you know when Normal is coming back? The last time I saw him was six days ago. I remember because it was the same day <u>that</u> guy came to town.










I stare out the window and wonder: Where has Normal gone? Chaos closed down the zoo, the library, and the playgrounds. Not much is the same.




Many good things are gone. Things like friends and parties and even toilet paper.




I wonder if Chaos scared Normal away with those masks everyone's wearing these days. Mom and Dad keep saying, "It won't always be like this."

But what if Chaos is here to stay? Will he scare everyone away?




## Hasn't anyone seen Normal?!






would it feel like Normal was still here?

Because there is a lot of distance between us these days.




Still, things are starting to feel almost... Normal?!



Normal, is that you? You look so different. What happened to you?




You have changed, Normal. But I have changed too.
